

## **Unified Regulatory Plan of the William & Mary Board of Visitors for State Fiscal Year 2025**

Prepared on June 21, 2024

### **Description of Agency or Boards**

The College of William & Mary in Virginia is the second oldest institution of higher education in the country. It serves more than 9,000 students. The main campus is located in Williamsburg and its School of Marine Science (Virginia Institute of Marine Science) is in Gloucester Point. The Board of Visitors for William & Mary also oversees Richard Bland College. Established in 1960, Richard Bland College is located in Prince George and serves more than 2,000 students through its full-time, part-time and dual degree programs. Among other statutory duties, the Board of Visitors is authorized to adopt regulations or institution policies for parking and traffic on property owned, leased, maintained, or controlled by its institutions.
