Agency Summary

The Department of Rail and Public Transportation is subject to the policy oversight of the Commonwealth Transportation Board. The department is empowered to do all the acts necessary or convenient for establishing, maintaining, improving, and promoting public transportation, transportation demand management, ridesharing, and passenger and freight rail transportation in the Commonwealth and to procure architectural and engineering services for rail and public transportation projects. Code of Virginia, Title <u>33.2-283</u>.

In addition to its general powers and enumerated statutory responsibilities, the department administers a number of state and federal funding programs to assist public transportation agencies and railroads in the operation, improvement or expansion of their services.

The department operates under the supervision of the Secretary of Transportation.

DRPT will not propose any changes to its lone regulation; however, it will make changes to its guidance documents.

Grant Application Guidance and Grant Management Procedures for Federal Transit Administration Section 5310: Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Programs

Brief Overview

DRPT awards Federal Transit Administration Section 5310 funding for the enhanced mobility of seniors (ages 65 and older) and individuals with disabilities. These awards fund capital projects to replace or expand vehicle fleets, mobility management projects to coordinate transportation, operating projects to provide transportation, and other capital projects to support programs serving the eligible populations. This guidance document outlines the process that agencies must follow to receive funding, and DRPT is making an annual adjustments to the process based on feedback received from the agencies.
