**Title of Proposed Regulatory Action or Guidance Document** Amend Standards for Licensed Child-Placing Agencies (22VAC40-131)

### **Brief Overview**

This regulation provide requirements for the public and DSS to evaluate the safety and stability of care that children and youth receive from licensed child placing agencies. Proposed amendments are intended to bring the regulation into alignment with federal Preventing Sex Trafficking and Strengthening Families Act of 2014 and the Family First Prevention Services Act of 2018. This regulatory action will also align with applicable requirements in Permanency Services-Prevention, Foster Care, Adoption, and Independent Living, 22VAC40-201 and Resource, Foster and Adoptive Family Home Approval Standards, 22VAC40-211. This action will align the regulation with state and federal law, remove and add definitions, and clarify language.

DSS Licensure and Disciplinary Guidelines
