SUBJECT: Survey on the Impact of a Potential Federal Government Shutdown

DEADLINE: September 18, 2015

As you probably are aware, Congress has not passed a budget for federal fiscal year 2016, which begins on October 1, 2015. The last time this happened, the federal government was shutdown for 16 days. That shutdown had different impacts on individual state agencies. In preparation for a potential shutdown of the federal government on October 1, the Governor's Chief of Staff has asked the Department of Planning and Budget to begin collecting information to assess the potential impact a shutdown would have on state operations.
