SUBJECT: Amendment #1 to DEQ's Unified Regulatory Plan (URP) for 2025-2026

Attached are eight additional tables to add to the Department of Environmental Quality's (DEQ) Unified Regulatory Plan (URP) for 2025-2026.

Two of these tables address regulatory actions that are necessary to address technical errors. The remaining tables are for guidance documents, two of which are clarifying guidance documents and four of which are necessary to enhance implementation of DEQ's construction stormwater program.

UNIFIED REGULATORY PLAN OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY FOR THE STATE FISCAL YEAR 2026

DESCRIPTION OF AGENCY:

The Department of Environmental Quality is authorized to implement all regulations adopted by its three citizen boards (Code of Virginia, Title 10.1, Chapter 11.1, Article 1.) Additionally, the department must promulgate regulations establishing: criteria for recycling equipment, facilities or devices for local taxation purposes (Code of Virginia, Title 58.1, Chapter 36, Article 5); a permit by rule or permits by rule for the construction and operation of small renewable energy projects, including such conditions and standards necessary to protect the Commonwealth's natural resources (Code of Virginia, Title 10.1, Chapter 11.1, Article 5); and regulations to implement the Uniform Environmental Covenants Act by establishing how activity and use limitations prescribed by an agency pursuant to an environmental response project are to be drafted, recorded and enforced (Code of Virginia, Title 10.1, Chapter 12.2.)

DESCRIPTION OF BOARDS:

The State Air Pollution Control Board

A seven-member citizen board authorized to, among other things, adopt regulations for the control and abatement of air pollution throughout the Commonwealth or in affected areas.

The State Water Control Board

A seven-member citizen board authorized to, among other things, establish standards of quality for state waters, policies and programs for area-wide or basin-wide quality controls, and requirements for treatment of sewage and industrial and other wastes.

The Virginia Waste Management Board

A seven-member citizen board authorized to, among other things, carry out the purposes and provisions of the Virginia Waste Management Act and compatible federal provisions and exercise general supervision and control over waste management activities in the Commonwealth.

EQ biosolids have been treated to a higher level of pathogen reduction than Class B biosolids. Va. Code § 62.1-44.19:3.A.1. requires that any person who land applies or markets and distributes any type of biosolids must do so under the authority of a VPA or VPDES permit. Va. Code § 62.1-44.19:3.C.1.) also specifies that regulations adopted by the State Water Control Board shall include requirements and procedures for the issuance and amendment of permits, including general permits, authorizing the land application, marketing or distribution of biosolids. Neither the VPA nor VPDES Permit Regulation include provisions for utilizing a general permit for marketing and distribution of EQ biosolids, hence the only vehicle currently available for DEQ to authorize marketing and distribution is an individual VPA or VPDES permit. EQ biosolids have been treated to a higher level of pathogen reduction than Class B biosolids. Va. Code § 62.1-44.19:3.A.1. requires that any person who land applies or markets and distributes any type of biosolids must do so under the authority of a VPA or VPDES permit. Va. Code § 62.1-44.19:3.C.1.) also specifies that regulations adopted by the State Water Control Board shall include requirements and procedures for the issuance and amendment of permits, including general permits, authorizing the land application, marketing or distribution of biosolids. Facilities that withdrawal two million gallons per day or less, or that use less than 25% of the water withdrawn from an adjoining waterbody exclusively for cooling purposes, must meet BTA determined on a best professional judgment basis.		
This guidance document will assist staff in determining the requirements for existing facilities that are below the thresholds stated above. The guidance reflects consideration of the criteria and requirements EPA has included in the Existing Facility regulation for minimizing impingement mortality and entrainment of aquatic organisms to the extent these requirements are appropriate for smaller facilities.		
This guidance document will provide public transparency about how DEQ is making these recommendations, enable the regulated community to appropriately prepare their permit applications/reapplications and facilitate multi-agency coordination on this rule.
