Agency Summary

The Virginia Department of Emergency Management's (VDEM) mission is to save lives through effective emergency management and homeland security programs by coordinating a whole of Commonwealth approach to any complex event or disaster including, but not limited to, any natural, man-made, acts of terrorism, or cyber-related incident or event. We achieve this mission through VDEM's responsibilities across the emergency management continuum which includes activities to prevent, prepare for, respond to, recover from, and mitigate threats to the Commonwealth with a diverse set of partners across local, state, tribal, and federal government agencies, the private sector, and non-profits.

Regulatory Activities

VDEM does not have any regulatory authority. The regulations listed below outline the Agency's guidelines for soliciting public participation for plans that are substantive in nature either wholly or in part. The below sections of the Administrative Code are the only code sections related to VDEM and do not impose mandates or express regulatory power. Due to the Agency's lack of regulations, VDEM does not have deregulatory projections to report.
