

Description of Agency or Boards

The Department of Fire Programs is a nationally-accredited fire service training entity in Virginia and provides training programs for both career and volunteer emergency responders throughout the Commonwealth. The agency provides financial assistance to Virginia's fire services through the distribution of the Aid-to-Localities (ATL) grant program as well as through various other grant programs (i.e. Live Fire Training Structure grant). The Agency is responsible for data collection, analysis, and information reporting to Virginia's fire services, Virginia's policy makers, and nationally to the National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS). The Agency also utilizes the data it collects to both identify and promote fire services best practices. VDFP provides both operational and technical assistances to communities in need during emergencies of all types. This includes both support in the Virginia Emergency Operations center (VEOC) and in-the field. The State Fire Marshal's Office [SFMO] within VDFP has the responsibility of protecting life and property for the citizens of the Commonwealth through the utilization of inspectors to complete fire safety inspections; by conducting building plans reviews for fire safety measures; and by conducting construction inspections for fire safety systems in all state buildings. VDFP also provides technical assistance and consultation services to Virginia's localities through the completion of fire and emergency medical services (EMS) studies.
